<u>Laburnum Cottage Farm Lane</u> <u>Margaret and Roger Stokes</u>

Conversation with Margaret and Roger Stokes 08/11/2022.

Laburnum Cottage was formerly two semi-detached cottages known as Bridge and Brook Cottage.

Margaret and Roger purchased Bridge Cottage from Roger's grandparents Authur Jones in 1975.

Brook Cottage was rented by the Jarret family who had lived there for many years. The Jarret family had 3 children and a lodger.

Mr Jarret was an agricultural worker and Brook cottage was tied to the job. Mr Bob Bebbington owned the cottage. He had previously owned both cottages which he had bought with an agricultural grant. He sold Bridge cottage to Roger's grandparents Mr & Mrs Aurthur Jones.

Following a fire in the fireplace of Brook cottage, which had burnt undetected for months, the cottage was put up for sale in approximately 1990 and Margaret and Roger purchased the cottage. They have slowly over the years made it into one cottage and a modern family home.

The Stoke's have owned all or part of Laburnum for 47 years.

Margaret recalls the garden having large and well established vegetable plots.

Notes on Brook Cottage and Bridge Cottage (now Laburnum Cottage) from Mrs Hall who lived in White Hart Cottage Farm Lane.

When I first remember these two cottages in 1920, Mr and Mrs Fred Pagett lived in Bridge Cottage with 3 small children and the Sankey family in Brook Cottage. Both cottages belonged to the Sankeys. When the Pagetts left Bridge Cottage to go down Heighways Lane, Mr and Mrs Walter Teague and 3 children came to live there from Windyridge on the old Watling Street. (Ted and Ada Buttery bought their house.) They stayed there until they got a council house in Church Stretton. Mary Sankey(Holloway) moved in with a little boy and she had another little boy while they lived there. Then Pattie Sankey(Jones) came for a time then moved to Novers Cottage.

During the war there were several lots of people in and out, soldiers' families and evacuees from London. Then Alf Sankey and his wife Doris came and lived in Bridge Cottage while their house was build on their land at the end of the lane, Longmynd View. John was born there. All this time, Mr and Mrs Sankey and the younger members of the family lived in Brook Cottage. Bessie, the pig lived in a sty by the gate, she had, I think one lot of piglets there. In the warm weather the smell was rather bad and I seem to remember using a whole bottle of Eau de Cologne!! Mrs Sankey brought us a small piece of Bessie for our Sunday Lunch which my husband thankfully buried in the garden! How old she was I've no idea!

There was a small wall between the two cottages which Mr Sankey had built, with a large stone in the middle saying 1715. He told my husband that he had worked on the cottage when it was partly taken down and modernised in 1910 and had taken the stone and put it in the wall. He said, when I go from here, you shall have it! My husband gave him half a crown for it on the day of the sale, and with help brought it into our garden where it still is!!

When Mrs Sankey died, Mr Sankey went to live with a daughter and everything was sold. Bob Bebbington bought both cottages with an Agricultural Grant and his two farm labourers came to live there. Denis Jarrett and his wife and 3 little girls lived in Brook Cottage and Brian Scott and his wife in Bridge Cottage. There was friction between them all so Bob Bebbington built a bungalow near the farm for Brian Scott and sold Bridge Cottage to Mr and Mrs Jones from Ludlow. The name was changed to Laburnum Cottage then and Mrs Jones fetched the Laburnum trees from Mrs Edwards at Bagbatch.
